



IS YOUR COPYING LEGAL?

Copyright Regulations

It is illegal to photocopy copyright works without authority.

The Copyright Act 1994 permits:

- copying of small extracts from a copyright work for criticism, review or news reporting as long as the source is acknowledged;
- copying or up to 10% of a book or one or two articles from a journal for your own personal research or private study. Copying for others is not permitted;
- copying by educational institutions for students of up to 3% or 3 pages of a work as long as that 3%/3 pages does not exceed 50% of the work (such as a small reader, a poem or an article from a periodical).

It does not permit:

- multiple copying of copyright material for others;
- copying of a whole work that is still protected by copyright and is available for purchase.

If you wish to copy any more from a published work than indicated above you should seek clearance from the copyright owner or obtain a licence from Copyright Licensing Ltd.
